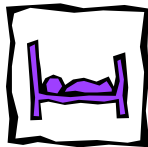




## 2006 Annual CAAHE Conference June 14-16, 2006, Newport Beach, CA

### ACCOMMODATIONS

### **AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION**
